Aim of the activity:

The objective of the workshop was to equip teachers with skills to incorporate music and rhythm in their teaching methods, to help students retain information in a fun and engaging manner.

Purpose of activity:

On 22nd and 23rd February 2023, the "Music Teacher Training" workshop was conducted by Mr. Len Tyler for teaching staff from Playgroup to Grade 5th at SOS Hermann Gmeiner Higher Secondary School Multan. The workshop was attended by our chairperson, Madam Mahnaz Fareed Sheikh, and Executive Committee Member Madam Maleeka Gardezi.

The workshop commenced at 10:00 am, with Madam Mahnaz Fareed Sheikh introducing Mr. Len Tyler to the SOS staff members. Mr. Tyler began by explaining some basic principles of music, such as teaching music through singing, using the voice as the first instrument, and developing the inner hearing.

He also emphasized the importance of using only high-quality folk-based material that reflects the cultural background and language of the child. Mr. Tyler also highlighted the significance of progressing systematically by taking small, logical steps, using multi-senses as much as possible, and unconsciously teaching elements before bringing them to conscious awareness.

Mr. Tyler then introduced the concept of rhythmic content using symbols such as "∏", "I", "Titi", and "Ta" and conducted various activities to clarify these concepts. After a tea break, the participants engaged in different activities in groups to teach through singing.

Mr. Tyler guided the coordinators that such activities could be conducted outside the classrooms to keep students healthy, strong, and fresh, developing their muscles. On the second day, Mr. Tyler divided the trainees into three groups and conducted an activity using drumsticks. The trainees also presented their cultural songs, poems, and tappies.

At the end of the workshop, all the trainees filled feedback forms, expressing their gratitude to SOS Management for providing such a useful platform for learning innovative and engaging teaching methods. Our Chairperson, Madam Mahnaz Fareed Sheikh, thanked Mr. Len Tyler for conducting the workshop and praised it for being interesting and fruitful.


